- We had 23 people attend a Makerspace event on March 23rd where we made reusable food cover cloths with cotton cloth, beeswax and pine resin. Yuliya Welk was our presenter. We have another one coming up later in April, on 4/27 at 1 at the Cable Community Centre. Area jeweler Mary Covelli will offer up a “Jewelry 101” session, showing us how to use basic tools of the trade. Participants will have an opportunity to make a pair of earrings or a key job. While registration is not required, it’s always nice to know how many plan to attend so that we can prepare accordingly.
