

TOWN OF CABLE SNOWMOBILE ORDINANCEORDINANCE NO. 9 AAN ORDINANCE REGULATING SNOWMOBILING WITHIN THE TOWN OF CABLE

The Town Board of the Town of Cable, meeting in regular session this 13th day of January, 1992, does ordain as follows:

1. All regulations regarding snowmobiles enacted by the Wisconsin State Statutes, under S.350.01 through S.350.19, are incorporated herein as set forth in full, and as amended hereafter.
2. Snowmobiles shall be operated on the right hand side of the road, shall display a lighted head lamp and tail lamp, and shall travel in single file.
3. Snowmobiles shall come to a complete stop at all intersections, including State, County, and Town.
4. Snowmobiles shall not exceed speeds of 25 miles per hour when operated on plowed roads or streets within the Town.
5. It shall be unlawful to operate a snowmobile within ten (10) feet of the traveled portion of any Town road not open to snowmobile traffic.
6. Any infringement of this Ordinance shall be punishable in accordance with penalties established under Wisconsin State Statutes and/or Town law.
7. This Ordinance repeals, rescinds, and supersedes Town of Cable Ordinance No. 9 and Amendments, which were in effect prior to the effective date of Ordinance No. 9 A.
8. SEVERABILITY: If any provision of this Ordinance is invalid or unconstitutional, or if the application of this Ordinance to any person or circumstances is invalid or unconstitutional, such invalidity or unconstitutionality shall not effect the provisions or applications of this Ordinance which can be given effect without the invalid or unconstitutional provision or applications.
9. This Ordinance, pursuant to S.350.47 (1988-89), Wisconsin Statutes, shall be filed with the State Department of Natural Resources, the County of Bayfield Traffic Office, and the Town of Cable Law Enforcement Office.

10. Operation of snowmobiles shall be lawful only on designated Town roads. The Town Board of the Town of Cable designates the following Town roads, or portions thereof, as snowmobile routes for the lawful operation of snowmobiles. Such operation shall be lawful only if designated by snowmobile route signs.
- a) Randysek Road
  - b) McNaught Road
  - c) Lipke Road - North from McAuley Road  $\frac{1}{2}$  mile and East for  $\frac{1}{2}$  mile to Lake Owen Drive.
  - d) McAuley Road - From Lipke Road West to Trail Inn Road Intersection.
  - e) Resort Road
  - f) Lake Owen Drive - From County Highway "M" North approximately 150 feet.
  - g) Kinzie Lane - Approximately 200 feet South on County Highway "M"
  - h) Perry Lake Road - From the former railroad right-of-way to the Perry Lake Public Landing.
  - i) Big Pine Drive -  $\frac{4}{10}$  ths. of 1 mile, between Lake Lodge Drive and Stone Pine Drive.
  - j) Sunset Drive
  - k) Big Brook Road
  - l) Short Road
  - m) Squaw Bend Road
  - n) Ole Lake Road
  - o) Totagatic Road
  - p) East Cable Lake Road
  - q) West Cable Lake Road
  - \*\* r) Frels Road - To junction of Telemark Road. (CLOSED 8/11/05)
  - \*\* s) Telemark Road -  $\frac{1}{4}$  mile South to Telemark Snowmobile Trail.
  - t) Spruce Street
  - u) Town Hall Road
  - v) First Avenue South - From Second Street South to end of Kavanaugh Road.
  - w) Second Street South
  - x) Flowers Road
  - y) Third Avenue
  - z) Wald Road (Effective 7/9/97)

AMENDMENT TO SNOWMOBILE ORDINANCE NO. 9

Section 4. Snowmobiles shall not exceed posted speed limits when operated on plowed roads or streets within the Town.

10. Operation of snowmobiles shall be lawful only on designated Town roads. The Town Board of the Town of Cable designates the following Town roads, or portions thereof, as snowmobile routes for the lawful operation of snowmobiles. Such operation shall be lawful only if designated by snowmobile route signs.

- a) Randysek Road
- b) McNaught Road
- c) Lipke Road – North from McAuley Road ½ mile and East for ½ mile to Lake Owen Drive
- d) McAuley Road – from Lipke Road West to Trail Inn Road Intersection
- e) Resort Road
- f) Lake Owen Drive – From County Highway “M” North approximately 150 feet
- g) Kinzie Lane – Approximately 200 feet South on County Highway “M”
- h) Perry lake Road – From the former railroad right-of-way to the Perry Lake Public Landing
- i) Big Pine Drive – 4/10ths of 1 mile, between Lake Lodge Drive and Stone Pine Drive (CLOSED 1/24/08)
- j) Cable Sunset Road
- k) Big Brook Road
- l) Short Road
- m) Leonard School Road
- n) Ole Lake Road
- o) Totagatic Road
- p) East Cable Lake Road
- q) West Cable Lake Road
- r) Frels Road (effective 3/12/13)
- s) Telemark Road – ¼ mile South to Telemark Snowmobile Trail
- t) Spruce Street
- u) First Avenue South – From Second Street South to end of Kavanaugh Road
- v) Second Street South
- w) Flowers Road
- x) Third Avenue
- y) Wald Road (Effective 7/9/97)
- z) Spider Lake Fire Lane – From beginning to Trail 8 (Effective 11/11/98)
- aa) Telemark Road – From Pilot Fish Inn to Telemark property line (Effective 2/13/02 for one year)

- bb) Amundson Road (Effective 11/14/02)
- cc) South Lake Owen Drive from County M to intersection of McAuley (Effective 11/14/07)
- dd) Trail Inn Road North to Perry Lake Road to connect into the Perry Lake Landing route through April 2014. (Effective 1/14/14)
- ee) Trail Inn Road South from Hwy M to the existing snowmobile route (about ¼ mile) through April 2014. (Effective 1/14/14)
